Halter show

- 1) There will be three age classes for calves. Males and Females are in separate classes. The age divisions are: Jan-April, May-August, September-December
- 2) Yearlings male and female separately January-June, July-December
- 3) Two year old girls
- 4) Three year old cows and older: To be eligible to compete, the cow must have an USYAKS registered offspring, or a DNA test showing that she's a parent, or a positive pregnancy test.
- 5) Steers:

- 1) Calves Male and Female separately Jan-April, May-August, September-December
- 2) Yearlings male and female separately January-June, July-December
- 3) two year old girls
- 4) Three year old cows and older: To be eligible, cow must have an USYAKS registered offspring, or a DNA test showing that she's a parent, or a positive preg test.

6) Hybrids: calf class - male and female separate

Three year old cows and older: To be eligible, cow must have an USYAKS registered offspring, or a DNA test showing that she's a parent, or a positive preg test.

7) Showmanship (hybrids may be shown) beginner (i.e. first time) intermediate (some limited experience) expert

- 8) Masquerade Class people and yak both in costume (Hybrids may be shown)
- 9) Obstacle Course (Hybrids may be shown)

Pen Show

The pen show will have all of the classes listed above for the halter show.

Additionally, there will be a cow/calf class. The calf must still be nursing and be no older than 8 months and 0 days.

Fiber

These were discussed, but it was decided that the final decision belonged to the Fiber Committee.

There was discussion of two age classes for on-yak judging. One suggestion was for calves to be one class, and the second class would consist of yearlings and older

There was a discussion of fiber arts being one class.
